## COMING THIS YEAR...

This year we look forward to some new initiatives! Please note the following:



#### Wi-Fi

Over the last four months, a great deal of research and attention has been given to our Wi-Fi infrastructure, with a plan to bring consistent connectivity for students and teachers. With the support of IT experts, we hope to have open Wi-Fi up and running in September!

#### **NEW ROLE**

We are excited to announce that Christine Rier will assume the role of Director of Advancement. While Rockway has had a Director of Development for many years (a position most recently held by Bernie Burnett), the responsibilities of the Director of Advancement will be full-time and extend more deeply in the area of donor cultivation, fund-raising, planned giving, alumni and volunteer development and systems and data management.

#### **CHROMEBOOKS**

Rockway continues to work at enhancing its technology and this year we look forward to integrating additional chromebooks into the Grade 7 and 8 Department. This year, thirty-six chromebooks will be housed on a new cart that will be permanently housed in Rooms 105/106, allowing for easy accessibility and manoeuverability.

#### ACADEMIC WORKSHOPS

This year the Math and English Departments will facilitate academic workshops that will take place on Wednesday, September 14 and Wednesday, February 1st during the MARS period. These workshops designed for all students, will be facilitated by Math and English teachers and will work at honing calculator skills and education on "What is Plagiarism," outlining Modern Language Association referencing form.

#### SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS WEEK - Social Media

September 27 – 29th will be Spiritual Emphasis Week. The focus of the week will be on "Social Media," and will feature David Balzer, Assistant Professor of Communications and Media at Canadian Mennonite University in Winnipeg, Manitoba. He is in demand as a public speaker, addressing new media, communication theory, alongside topics such as Christianity and the mass media in Canada. Mr. Balzer will give 3 chapel addresses, an evening address for parents and constituents, and will also visit classes during his time here.

#### MUSICAL YEAR – The Wizard of Oz

Every three years Rockway produces an All-School Musical. This year students in Grade 7-12 will have the opportunity to participate in a musical that incorporates comedy, drama and fantasy! ## 2016-2017 STUDENT PLANNER

Student accounts will be billed \$6.00 for the planner. We are confident that students, parents and teachers will find this planner an invaluable aid. There is **only one copy per student**; please **put your name in it** and take good care of it.

## **ELECTRONIC DEVICES**



Students are not allowed to use their electronic devices in school chapels / assemblies, testing situations, change-rooms or washrooms within the school.

Students may use their electronic devices in class if deemed appropriate by the teacher. This means that expectations for electronic device usage in classes will vary from teacher to teacher / class to class. Expectations for each class will be explained by the teacher at the start of each semester and reviewed from time to time throughout the semester.

If used inappropriately, these devices will be confiscated by the teacher and turned into the main office. The receptionist will inform the Assistant Principal of the situation. Students may pick up their cell phone at the end of the day, following a conversation with the Assistant Principal. If inappropriate use continues, Rockway's Discipline Policy will be implemented, including contact with the parents.

## ROCKWAY'S DRESS CODE

At Rockway, we stress the principles of **personal cleanliness, self-respect, and good taste** when determining guidelines for appropriate school attire. We strive to reinforce in all students a sense of responsibility to self and others, by encouraging all to dress in a manner which promotes a positive and productive learning environment, rather than in a manner that detracts from it. We believe that fashion industry and trends do not necessarily dictate what is appropriate at school, so Rockway's expectations for appropriate school attire are as follows:

- Briefs and boxers should not be visible.
- Muscle shirts, low-cut shirts, off the shoulder tops, halter tops and spaghetti straps should not be worn unless they are covered with a sweatshirt, sweater, shrug or shirt.
- Shorts must cover the entire bum with an additional 1½ or more inches of length below the bum.
- Skirts and dresses need to reach to the midthigh, so when the student bends over, their bum will not be exposed.
- Footwear must be worn at all times for health and safety reasons.
- Clothing with inappropriate words, phrases, or graphics that do not align with Rockway's Mission and Four Pillars are not to be worn.
- Hats, hoods and ear buds need to be removed during chapel.
   In the interest of enhancing community life at Rockway, students are encouraged to refrain from using ear buds in the hallways and in the lunchroom. Students are asked to respect the direction of their individual teachers regarding this expectation in their individual classes.

#### **CONSEQUENCES:**

Students who choose to disregard these guidelines will be sent to the office and asked to change their clothing (with clothing from their locker, from the school clothing box, or from home) before proceeding to their next class. Repeated reminders will result in further conversation and contact with home.

### **FOOD SERVICES**





# ONTARIO SECONDARY SCHOOL LITERACY TEST 2016-2017

During the 2016-2017 school year, EQAO will offer eligible students two opportunities to write the OSSLT online. The early opportunity will count as a formal attempt to fulfill the literacy requirement.

At Rockway, all eligible students will write the literacy test on October 20th online. Students will have two preparation sessions facilitated by the English Department prior to October 20th. The regularly scheduled OSSLT on March 30th will also be available to students who were unsuccessful following the first attempt.
