LEARNING THROUGH HISTORY AND CULTURE. BUILDING FRIENDSHIPS AND COMMUNITY.

Each June, a number of Rockway students fundraise to experience a nineteen day exchange visit with Rockway's host school Weierhof Gymnasium in Germany. After visiting the Rhineland-Palatinate region, the group travels to Paris and then on to Strasbourg.

Faculty recall that early on, cellphones were cast aside on the grass while Canadian and German students played volleyball and ping pong at the hostel in Heidelberg. Teachers witnessed more community when students sang in harmony as soon as they got into the Mennonite church in Weierhof village.

Like anyone in Europe this summer, participants learned to navigate the exceptional heat wave. Without air conditioned rooms, they located public swimming places and took advantage of time spent on air conditioned buses and in air conditioned museums.

The trip did push students to do new things, and hopefully, grow as individuals. Throughout, students looked out for each other with care and concern, whether it was ensuring everyone got on and off the Métro or talking about making good choices. Students learned to face any challenges with maturity, and with support from faculty and host families; another lasting reminder of the value of new found friendships and community.

LET'S TALK ABOUT POWER, SEX AND SPIRITUALITY

SPIRITUAL EMPHASIS WEEK 2019 September 24-26



We share parents' concern for students' health and well-being. And also appreciate that sometimes, students and families need space, support and resources to explore important conversations, particularly ones that relate to students' spirituality and making healthy choices. This is what inspires Rockway's annual Spiritual Emphasis Week.

This year, the conversation focuses on 'power, sex and spirituality'. Building healthy relationships in community involves careful choices about how we express our sexuality and spirituality. It means paying close attention to our bodies and to our own power.

At three all-school chapels with students, faculty and staff, Dr. Carol Penner will use a story from the Bible about Joseph to help us think about power and consent. We'll explore intimacy and abuse as we look at stories from our lives and our culture. We'll talk about learning to make good choices about sex and how bad choices impact our lives, and how our core spiritual values can help us survive and thrive.

Chapel titles include:

- Tuesday Joseph: Power and Abuse
- Wednesday Healthy Relationships: Sex and Power
- Thursday Living Out Our Values in Community

Dr. Penner teaches practical theology at Conrad Grebel University College. She has a Ph.D. in Systemic Theology, and her area of expertise involves helping churches talk about the reality of violence and abuse. She has been a pastor and a freelance writer. Dr. Penner's blog of worship resources can be found at **leadinginworship.com**. Theatre of the Beat and the Sexual Assault Support Centre of Waterloo Region will also present workshops throughout the week.

We invite parents and community members to join the conversation for a special **Evening Presentation**, **Wednesday, September, 25, 2019, 7:00 pm**. *Healthy Relationships: Let's Talk about Power, Sex and Spirituality.*

The evening will include a summary of Dr. Penner's addresses, and a panel of people who will talk about these themes from the experiences of their various roles/perspectives. This *free* event is made possible with support from Mennonite Church Eastern Canada (MCEC). *There is no need to register. All are welcome*. Simply join us and participate in an evening of learning and sharing, as we support students in building healthy relationships.



THE WILMER MARTIN FAMILY SCHOLARSHIP FUND

This school year will be the first year we award The Wilmer Martin Family Scholarship. Monies donated to this Scholarship are invested, the annual interest of which will be used to financially assist a student. Preference will be given to a student entering Grade 7, who is from a Mennonite family for which tuition is a barrier to enrollment, but all students are welcome to apply. "Education has always been an important focus for Janet and me. Our parents set an example for us in the value of Christian education. Janet's father sent all six of his children to Lancaster Mennonite High (LMH) School. That was twenty-four years of tuition. After all of his children had graduated, he decided to pay tuition to assist some children whose families didn't have the means to attend LMH. He did this for an additional ten years.

My parents did not finish Grade 8 and were required to leave school and help their parents on their family farms. However, they were committed that their four children would finish high school. They too sent us to Lancaster Mennonite High School for Grades 11 and 12 as dorm students since we lived a hundred miles away from the school.

Janet and I were grateful for Rockway Mennonite Collegiate. Our children, Janelle ('86 – above, right) and Alan ('89 – above, centre), both attended and graduated from here. After our grandchildren Matthew and Miriam were born, Janet expressed the desire that she hopes and prays that Alan and Christiane will choose to send them here too. After Janet died in September 2016, I discussed with my children my desire to do something here at Rockway in honour of Janet.

The scholarship announced signifies the commitment of our family to continue the vision that Janet held close to her heart. Thank you for giving us this opportunity to partner with you in providing educational opportunities for other students."
