Our chapel theme for this year also gives important context to the many Rockway activities that connect directly to our vision, mission and values as a community, such as Spiritual Emphasis Week, our annual Food Drive in support of the House of Friendship and Envirathon Servathon day. With these and other commitments, including our new Indigenous Learning Group, Rockway is well positioned to put love into "radical action."

So, what does it mean to love our neighbour as ourselves? To do no harm to a neighbour? Asking these questions and exploring these issues will be challenging at times, but doing so also holds the possibility of living joyfully; of discovering what it means to be "not far from the kingdom of God."

#### **HEPA FILTERS**

Thank you parents! As a direct response to ensuring the health and safety of students, faculty, staff, and visitors, Rockway has purchased HEPA filters (an 'Austin') for each classroom. Made possible through the generous contributions of Rockway families, these institutional grade filters improve the air quality throughout the school. These filters, as well as dozens of Public Health and Ministry guidelines, have allowed Rockway to resume in-class teaching this fall.

#### CHORTITZA TREE

Next time you're at Rockway, be sure to visit the newly planted Chortitza Tree on our front lawn. The tree was planted in recognition of Rockway's 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on February 15, 2020. The brass plaque, donated by *Riverside Brass and Aluminum Foundry*, provides context and significance of the tree:



This tree descends from and grows in memory of the great oak in Chortitza, Ukraine. For over 800 years, the great oak provided a gathering place and landmark for many, including Mennonites who settled in the Ukraine in the 18th century. This oak tree is planted at Rockway with deep appreciation for the strength of faith and community that led to the founding of this school, and in recognition of those who continue to learn and grow here and those who continue to support and nurture them.

Originally, our Design & Technology (D&T) program students were going to design and build the cart, which Steckle will use for sharing vegetables.


When students were unable to be on campus due to the pandemic, D&T teacher Don Dyck Steinmann came up with another plan.

Thank you to Steckle Heritage Farm for fostering this creative partnership with us. We look forward to enjoying with our community, the fruit of our future shared efforts!








## **STAYING CONNECTED**
