
Other trip highlights included spending time with Rockway Alumna, Jenny Chan (Class of 2015), who is presently studying at university, and joining current Rockway parents for dinner. We shared thoughtful conversations about their children and listened to the stories of what led them to Rockway.

The most powerful moment of the trip, however, was re-connecting with Principal Zhang at the Xiangcheng Middle School. He was one of five Chinese administrators who visited Rockway in November 2015, to celebrate the over 20 year partnership between Rockway and Xindu No. 1 Middle School that was established under the leadership of past-Principal, Bert Lobe.

As part of a gift exchange, Principal Zhang presented me with a beautiful photo book, commemorating the Chinese Delegation visit in 2015. I was not fully aware of the impact their time with us had on them until I opened up the book. Inside there were quotes celebrating friendship and fortitude in education, alongside photos of the moments they had shared with us. In addition to this powerful gift exchange, David and I were honoured at a formal Chinese feast, where toasts and words were exchanged and I was reunited with the other members of the Chinese Delegation. Together, we celebrated our friendship and partnership!

Travelling to Asia left me with tangible and profound moments which connect me more deeply with Rockway's mission, a mission that "broadens, enriches and challenges students' learning and world-view."

Our daughter, Jamie, Class of 2016, is one of Rockway's 4,000 Alumni. I've watched her grow from a shy girl into a confident young woman in high school, who is now in her third year of university. Our son, James, will soon graduate and also become a Rockway Alumnus. I will always remember watching him play for the Rockway Senior Boys Volleyball team against the Alumni team at the Alumni Sports Challenge during Connections Weekend. I could barely hear myself cheer amidst the energy in the room! I will be cheering him on in the upcoming basketball season. Go Flames!

For 73 years, Rockway has been here for students and families, offering a unique high school education rooted in values, compassion, reflection, and a global community. I believe it is something worth supporting.

As an independent high school in Ontario, Rockway relies entirely on tuition fees, some rental income and fundraising. Tuition fees cover approximately 85% of our annual operating budget. Rental income alone cannot make up the remaining gap. Nor can it fund desperately needed facility maintenance and upgrades. **You can help.**

In 2016, we launched Lead Us Onward, a comprehensive 4 year, \$3 million campaign to build bright futures (see more at rockway. ca). This year, the campaign includes fundraising goals of \$440,000 for daily operations and tuition assistance, and another \$300,000 for facility improvements (remember, we continue to have a matching pledge of up to \$125,000/year for the revitalization of school facilities, in effect doubling the power of your donation!).

Rockway's most recent Annual Report (available at rockway.ca) shows the difference you are making in students' lives, but we have much work left to do, from new roofs to ensuring adequate tuition assistance support.

VOLUNTEERS GO BEYOND FOR ROCKWAY'S STUDENTS LEARNING IN COMMUNITY (SLIC)



Our journey at Rockway focuses on students developing an ability to lead with compassion when classroom learning is extended so they can live Christ-centred values, develop empathy and perspective, and serve the community, locally and globally. This is the inspiration behind Rockway's new Students Learning In Community (SLIC) partnerships.

Volunteers travel with students to partner organizations and participate in programming alongside students for a morning or afternoon. Currently, there are a number of partnerships supported by a team of volunteers (KW Habilitation, The Working Centre—Recycle Cycles and St. John's Kitchen, and the Strong Start Reading Program). Volunteers who support Design & Technology students at Recycle Cycles are self-proclaimed 'gear-heads'. They have found it very satisfying to help students learn some new skills while refurbishing bicycles for our community members.



This past spring, Rockway parent, Kevin Bradshaw, travelled weekly with Gr. 8 Science students to KW Habilitation, where they assisted with their Our Farm program. Currently, Kevin is going with Business Leadership students on weekly visits to St. John's Kitchen, where they assist with meal clean-up and talk with the program manager about operations. "I can see the impact that the work is having on students and on our community," reports Kevin.

In keeping with our 'Going Beyond' strategic plan, SLIC partnerships will touch students at all grade levels this year. This is only possible with the generous support of caring volunteers and the collaboration of community partners.




